A number of initiatives are underway to apply the principles of the patient centred medical home in the Australian context. To be effective in improving integration it is important to ensure that any approach recognises the broader concepts of health neighbourhoods, inter sectoral partnerships and networks.

This event brings the experiences and lessons from the implementation of the Rainbow Model of Integrated Care and international primary care developments through two visiting academics from the Netherlands, Dr Pim Valentijn and Professor Chris van Weel, to our local context ACI will also take the opportunity to launch its new website 'Navigating the Health Care Neighbourhood'.



Dr. Pim Valentijn is a principal investigator and consultant in the field of value-based healthcare. Valentijn's research focus is on assessing the value of integrated services models in primary and secondary care settings. He developed the Rainbow Model of Integrated Care and associated survey which has been pilot tested in Australia. His specific skills are to translate scientific knowledge into practical tools for care providers, purchasers of care, policymakers and patients. Valentijn holds a Ph.D. from Tilburg University and a M.Sc. from VU University. He currently works as a senior research consultant of Essenburgh Training and Consultancy and is affiliated with University of Maastricht.



Professor Chris van Weel has been Professor of General Practice from 1985 to 2012, and Chair of Department of Primary and Community Care, at the Radboud University Nijmegen the Netherlands. He was the professor of Primary Health Care research, Australian Primary Health Care Research Institute, Australian National University, Canberra. He bridge s the domains of public health and individual primary health care and engages in innovative regional health care reform in the 'Leader Practices Programme". He also was President of the World Organization of Family Doctors, Wonca, 2007 – 2010.
